

Local Rules

Out of bounds (Rule 27)

The following areas are out of bounds:

- beyond any wall, fence, posts or white stakes defining the course
- practice ground
- Clubhouse area

Where out of bounds is defined by white stakes or fence posts (excluding angled supports) the imaginary line joining the nearest inside points (course side) at ground level defines the boundary. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies over such line.

Movable obstructions (Rule 24 - 1)

- stones in bunkers
- drop zone posts (these must be replaced)

Non-movable Obstructions (Rule 24 - 2)

- all artificially surfaced roads and paths
- staked trees
- at Hole 17, Greenwood: the wooden hut
- sprinkler heads

Water Hazard (Rule 26 - 1)

For a ball in the water hazard in front of the green, the player may, under penalty of one stroke, drop a ball within two club lengths of the drop zone post, away from the green. This is an additional option to rule 26 - 1.

Lateral Water Hazards (in addition to Rule 26 - 1c)

For a ball in the lateral water hazard to the right and behind these holes, the player may drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, within two club lengths of the nearest drop zone post to the point at which his ball last crossed the margin of the hazard. The opposite margin is deemed to extend to infinity on holes 2, 3 and 4 only.

Overhead Power lines

If a ball strikes an overhead power line, telephone line or cable the stroke must be cancelled and replayed without penalty (see Rule 20-5). If the ball is not immediately recoverable another ball may be substituted.

Exception: a ball striking the elevated junction section of a cable rising from the ground shall not be replayed.
